Graduate Program in Performing Arts

Introduction

The Graduate Program in Performing Arts is designed to prepare students for professional careers in music. It offers applied majors in voice, keyboards (piano and organ), stringed instruments (violin, viola and cello) and wind instruments (flute).

Building on the four-year undergraduate curriculum, the graduate program requires not only technical mastery of musical performance, but also a master's thesis about relevant performance styles. The thesis should utilize both theoretical analysis and document-based research.

The curriculum has the following four aspects:

- [A] Elective Required Studies and Elective Required Seminars. Faculty members offer master classes which students can take regardless of their applied fields or major instruments.
- [B] Elective Courses in performance practice, church music, creative business strategy, and physical discipline.
- [C] Elective Performing Arts (private lessons)
- [D] Master's degree performance and thesis project
